ORDER

In absence of appropriations or a continuing resolution, this court adopts the following contingency plan to enable it to fulfill its constitutional duties to continue to hear and resolve cases: (1) in which there is a constitutional or statutory grant of jurisdiction, (2) emergency activities necessary for the safety of human life and protection of property; and, (3) activities otherwise authorized by law.

The judge, chamber's staff, officers and employees of the court perform functions that are necessary and essential. This court shall, according to normal schedules and priorities: (1) hear and decide cases without interruption; (2) process all cases; and (3) issue and enforce judgments. The court limits activities to those functions necessary and essential to the resolution of cases, and suspends all activities not authorized in support of these duties. The incurrence of hiring employees, as opposed to replacement employees, and related pay actions, purchasing equipment, supplies and contractual services, entering into new contractual obligations, performing nonessential administrative tasks, compiling non-essential statistics; training, and travel are suspended.

This Order is subject to modifications or amendments should circumstances warrant and shall remain in effect throughout the current governmental shutdown.
