NOTICES TO CREDITORS

GENERAL ORDER NO. 2020-03

On December 1, 2020, Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2002(h) is modified providing for notice to creditors filing claims in a voluntary chapter 7 case, chapter 12 case, or chapter 13 case, after 70 days following the order for relief under that chapter or the date the order converting a case to Chapter 12 or 13;¹ 90 days after the order for relief in an involuntary chapter 7 case;² and in cases where notice of insufficient assets to pay a dividend is given to creditors under Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2002(e), after 90 days following the mailing of notice of time for filing claims under Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3002(c)(5).³

The court adopts the following procedure to effectuate the amended Rules.


To provide for limited notice, a party must file a notice establishing the limited notice list, upon meeting the requirements of Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2002(h)(1), (2) and (3), providing current names and addresses to serve the entities listed below:

- 1) Debtor;
- 2) Trustee;
- 3) Indenture trustees;
- 4) Creditors holding claims for which proofs of claims are filed;
- 5) Creditors, if any, permitted to file claims because an extension was granted under Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3002(c)(1) or (c)(2); and,
- 6) Parties who filed an entry of appearance or request for notice.


The party filing the limited notice list is responsible for keeping the list current, as reflected on the docket.
